
MUSIC IN THE LITURGY How the Somber Sounds of Lent Prepare Us for Easter Joy

God created in us a bundle of conflicting emotions that help us process our experiences and express ourselves. Webster's dictionary defines this contrast as "bringing out qualities that are strikingly different" between one item and another. Comfort is a welcome sequel to anguish. Joy is greater when we have known misery. Celebration finds euphoric meaning after periods of loss.

The music of Lent and Easter helps us to understand Jesus's experiences as 100% human and 100% divine. We begin with cries for mercy, move on to music that conveys torment and suffering as Jesus journeys to the cross, and end with triumphant exhilaration when his tomb is found empty on Easter morning. Palm Sunday bundles many of these contrasts into a package as we experience a whirlwind of changing circumstances and emotions, from shouts of "Hosanna" to cries of "Crucify Him!"

We have a second opportunity this year during Holy Week to explore the realm of humanness, when a 50-voice Ecumenical Choir and other ensembles sing, read, and ring the meaning of The Apostles' Creed at our Holy Week concert on March 28 (see the poster on page 6 for details). The creed's twelve statements explore the gamut of emotions: jubilant music relays "He was...born of the Virgin Mary," followed immediately by agonizing music that pierces the soul like nails at "He suffered under Pontius Pilate and was crucified, died, and was buried," and exuberant expressions of "I believe in the Holy Spirit."

Open your heart to the sensations of Lent and Easter. Let God's gift of emotion, combined with intention, propel you to respond joyfully to the gift of God's love that was, is, and ever shall be!

Centre County has between an 11 and 12% illiteracy rate. These members of our community have serious challenges when it comes to getting a driver's license, getting a job and simply maneuvering through life in our midst.

One local organization has a mission focused on aiding these individuals: the **Mid-State Literacy Council**. The Mid-State Literacy Council will be the recipient of Grace Lutheran's Easter Alternative Offering this year.

Founded in 1971 by a small group of local people, and led by our own Ruth Kistler, Mid-State Literacy has been aiding those in our community with classes and tutoring for 46 years! Ruth Kistler STILL volunteers there.

Their small space in downtown State College houses a number of differently-sized classrooms and conference rooms where their clients come to learn. The Council has a very small staff and a sizable corps of volunteers who lead classes and tutoring sessions.

Mid-State Literacy Council serves over 250 people each year even though the agency's funding has all but vanished. Individuals who are unable to pay for their services are served anyway. The Council gratefully awaits our support and donations to assist them.



The gap between our income needs and dollars collected to carry out budgeted ministries increased this month, minimally increasing our shortfall in giving. We are keeping costs under budget to compensate for the income shortfall, which affects some ministries.

DID YOU KNOW...

...that there are two AED's (Automatic Emergency Defibrillators) at the church?




- One is located by the **Welcome Center**,
- and the other is by the entrance to the **Miller Center gym**.
- They are easy to use!
- The machine will tell you exactly what to do.
- And there are pictures located on the defibrillator pads as to where to place them correctly.
- **Keeping as calm as possible is the key to any emergency.**
- You cannot hurt anyone using this device.
- If the person does not have a heartbeat, there is nothing you can do to make the situation worse.
- Not doing anything would be the problem.
- Getting the person to lie down, calling 911, starting CPR if trained and activating the Automatic Emergency Defibrillator is the only way of saving a life.
- If the person is unconscious and the AED pads are in place, the device will not activate a charge unless it does not find a pulse (heart beat).
- Be prepared to act. **Do not be afraid.**
- There are a number of medical people who are members of the church, and you will not be alone.

Green Tip for March

With all the salt we've been driving through, many people will likely be washing vehicles.

According to *ThoughtCo* (<https://www.thoughtco.com/eco-friendly-car-washing-1203931>), washing our cars in our driveways is an environmentally unfriendly chore. Unlike household waste water that enters sewers or septic systems and undergoes treatment before it is discharged into the environment, what runs off from your car sweeps down your driveway and goes right into storm drains—and eventually into regional water systems.

On the other hand, federal laws require commercial car wash facilities to drain their wastewater into sewer systems. And commercial car washes use computer controlled systems and high-pressure nozzles and pumps that minimize water usage. Many also recycle and re-use the rinse water. According to one report, washing a car at home typically uses between 80 and 140 gallons of water, while a commercial car wash averages less than 45 gallons per car.



If you must wash your car at home, choose a biodegradable soap made for vehicle use. Or you can make your own by mixing one cup of liquid dishwashing detergent and 3/4 cup of powdered laundry detergent (each should be chlorine- and phosphate-free and non-petroleum-based) with three gallons of water.

Even when using green-friendly cleaners, it is better to avoid the driveway and instead wash your car on your lawn or over dirt so that the toxic waste water can be absorbed and neutralized in soil. Also, try to sop up sudsy puddles that remain. They contain toxic residues and can tempt thirsty animals.


Welcome, New Members
