Who are you following?

My great-uncle Buzza Thompson ("Uncle Buzz" to the family) was quite a character. He was raised in Forest County, Pennsylvania, one of the most rural places in the entire Commonwealth. He has been gone from this world for several decades now, but family stories and anecdotes about him continue to abound.

My favorite one concerns a time when Uncle Buzz was driving several family members on an excursion into upstate New York. These were the days before GPS and smart phones, but even good old paper maps were not something Uncle Buzz considered worth consulting. As you might guess, at some point on his journey within the boundaries of the Empire State he got lost. His passengers understandably became nervous, wondering how they would get home. But Uncle Buzz was unconcerned. He said, "See that car ahead of us? It has Pennsylvania plates. I'll just follow it and he'll lead us back home."

That was cold comfort to everyone else in the car, but for Uncle Buzz it was enough. Somehow they <u>did</u> manage to get back home. But aside from constituting a colorful anecdote about a memorable character,

what does this little story about Uncle Buzz tell us about our faith lives?

One possible moral of the story is to simply have faith. Trust in the signs (in this case a license plate) and just keep moving forward, confident that some higher power will miraculously get you back home. Certainly as your pastor I want you to have faith and to trust in the goodness of a God we cannot see and often do not understand.

But that would be an unwise lesson to draw from Uncle Buzz's driving exploits. Faith is not totally blind. We have a rich repository within the Church to help us make decisions. Most authoritative of all is God's Word - Holy Scripture. But we are also blessed with the teachings of wise and trustworthy historic leaders within the Church, as well as liturgy, hymnody, and the historic creeds. All of these things provide insight for us – measuring sticks if you will – to help us evaluate questions of faith.

Consider, for example, what the letter to the Ephesians says:

We must no longer be children, tossed to and fro and blown about by every wind of doctrine, by people's trickery, by their craftiness in deceitful scheming. But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, joined and knit together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love. (Ephesians 4:14-16)

Grace Lutheran has <u>always</u> been firmly anchored in God's Word. As a result, we won't always have

the trendiest of worship music or feature the latest and greatest styles from the religious hipsters. It is enough that we offer God's Word. God's grace. God's Holy Sacraments of baptism and communion. We navigate our way forward by following Christ and his cross, not signs like solar eclipses or automobile license plates. So stay anchored to Christ, dear friends. Or you might get taken for a ride far more nerve-wracking than anything Uncle Buzz ever did.

Holy Week and Easter

Thank you for your faithful participation in our Holy Week and Easter services. On Easter Sunday, the combination of people who worshiped in our building and watched online exceeded the numbers we used to draw prior to COVID. It was a wonderful day! Thank you as well for your enthusiastic support of a new addition to our Holy Week schedule, afternoon Stations of the Cross with our friends at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church. Being a new and (to many Lutherans at least) somewhat unfamiliar practice, we were not sure how many might attend. We were joyfully overwhelmed with over a hundred worshipers! It was a very meaningful addition to Lent, and is a shared service that our two congregations plan to continue together.

Signs of the Times

Have you seen our refreshed sign at the corner of Beaver and Garner? The old lettering was showing its age, and the face lift gave us the opportunity to add the preschool's name. Grace Lutheran Preschool is not a separate entity or just a tenant in this building. It is a ministry of Grace Lutheran Church. We should be very proud of that. The preschool has a new sign near its main entrance too, and for the first time we added lettering to our Miller Center

entrance so that it is easier for our guests to find.

Lynn Welcome Center

Our Narthex is also in the midst of being refreshed. Council recently engaged a talented designer, Matthew Stetson of Studio 216 in Bellefonte, to guide us. The result will be a space that accents the existing style of our iconic building's interior while creating a welcoming environment and useful gathering space. As I have previously noted, this space will eventually be named the Lynn Welcome Center, in honor of the ministry of Grace Pastor-Emeritus Steve Lynn. It will be an attractive, welcoming, and functional space for people as they enter Grace's building and will enable us to extend the best of hospitality in the same tradition that was the hallmark of Pastor Lynn's ministry. New furniture and countertops are just part of the transformation. We will gradually but steadily see improvements and modifications over the coming months as items are delivered and installed.

"Breathe your Spirit into all who are gathered here and into all creation. Illumine our days. Enliven our bones. Dry our tears. Wash away the sin within us, and drown the evil around us. Satisfy all our thirst with your living water, Jesus Christ, our Savior, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen."



All You Need is Love

"Little children, just love one another." That's what the Apostle John said every week to the church in his old age. Love looks like lots of things. Some days I am visiting my Dad and discovering the joy of Balloon Ball. Other times I am caring for my granddaughter; checking in with my Mom; Face-timing with our overseas daughter; or reassuring our Lancaster County daughter and mom of a toddler. All of these are blessings.

At the same time, when Scripture tells us about honoring our parents, many of us find we have an aging parent or parents while still raising or supporting our own children. Not only might we provide care and financial support to parents and

children, nearly four in ten people say both their grown children and their parents rely on them for emotional support. Love asks lots of things. Culture calls living in this phenomenon being a part of "The Sandwich Generation."

There are actually three kinds of sandwiches:

- The Traditional sandwich: Adults who care for aging parents and young children.
- The Club sandwich: Adults who care for aging parents, adult children, and their grandchildren OR who care for aging parents, young children, and grandparents.
- The Open-faced sandwich: Anyone else who helps provide care for loved ones with a chronic concern or lives with disability and care asks much.

However, SAVE THE DATE:



Green Tip for May

As I write this, I am preparing to help in the annual Clearwater Conservancy watershed clean-up day. From past experience, I expect to find many single-use plastic bottles in the trash we will be collecting. I recently returned from a trip to Europe. There, most beverages were sold in glass or metal, not plastic. Both of those things led me to write this tip to encourage you to do everything you can to limit your own use of plastic and



encourage others to do the same. Despite what the labels may say, very little of "recyclable" plastic gets recycled. Much of it ends up in trash, waterways or is burned.

Things you can do:

Move away from "throw-away."

Consider alternatives to the usual single-use plastic items in your home. Consider bamboo toothbrushes, shampoo bars, aluminum water bottles, reusable silicone baggies and "waxed" paper wrap, for example.

Tell your friends what you are doing.

Talk about why reducing plastic use is important to you. Recount your changes as steps in a journey and invite them to join you in tackling the problem. Encourage them; avoid creating any embarrassment.

Advocate for change in your office.

Check out the kitchen and coffee station. Styrofoam cups and plastic stirrers get thrown away but never go away. Look for non-plastic alternatives. Buy a package of linguine pasta, break the strands in half and use them to stir the coffee or tea

Look for opportunities to educate and encourage your groups and organizations.

Consider a "This—Not That" display showing alternatives to single-use plastic. Plan a special program. Arrange to clean up a nearby stream or roadway as a service project.

Donate to organizations that are addressing the plastic problem on a larger scale. Your financial support enables them to reach far and wide. Check out these: EarthDay.org, Plastic-Free July, The Story of Stuff Project, specifically The Story of Bottled Water.

Boycott companies that use excessive plastic packaging. Purchase from businesses that are committed to environmentally friendly practices as well as plastic-free products. Look for B Corp certification. Read the "About" tab on websites. Complain if you receive something with plastic packaging. Buy food not wrapped in plastic.

Push your state or city to ban specific single-use plastics.

Get your local policymakers on the "ban-wagon."

Contact your Representative to advocate for passage of the bill to amend the Solid Waste Disposal Act. Currently only in the "introduced" phase is the bill H.R. 6053: "To amend the Solid Waste Disposal Act to reduce the production and use of certain single-use plastic products and packaging, to improve the responsibility of producers in the design, collection, reuse, recycling, and disposal of consumer products and packaging, to prevent pollution from consumer products and packaging from entering into animal and human food chains and waterways, and for other purposes."

Approach every day with gratitude.

God has gifted us with an amazing planet—not wrapped in plastic. Our faithful response is to cherish and care for this treasure.

In Memoriam: Pat Lloyd (organist at Grace)

Patricia (Pat) Lloyd – who until her passing was the longest-standing staff member at Grace Lutheran Church – died peacefully in the night on Tuesday, April 16, 2024. Born on St. Patty's Day in 1935 (and named to mark the day), she was a friendly, kind person who was known for her generous and cheerful hospitality as well as her musical gifts.



Trained as a pianist, Pat served Grace as an organist in her early years alongside Grace member Koya Ohmoto and later alongside June Miller as well as playing piano for our early morning worship services and numerous congregational events. In addition to her work at Grace, Pat taught piano classes for many years at State High; was a co-founder of the Central Pennsylvania Music Teachers Association Phyllis Triolo Music Competition, which provided scholarship funds for talented high school students; and played flute for the ensemble Toot-in-Common. Family was Pat's first focus, but music was not far behind; she was still teaching piano privately the week she made her final journey home to her Creator.
