

ABOUT TODAY'S THEME...Visions abound in the readings for the sixth Sunday of Easter. Paul has a vision about what to do. John has a vision of what will be. The risen Lord Jesus provides counter-cultural visions for who is loved and blessed in God's kingdom.

ABOUT THE LESSONS.... **The First Lesson:** A vision compels Paul to move his ministry into Greece. There he meets Lydia, an important person in the business community, whose heart has been opened by God to receive the gospel. Her conversion and baptism provide the impetus for the founding of the church at Philippi. **The Second Lesson:** John's vision of a new Jerusalem coming out of heaven provides continuity with God's past actions. Yet in this new city, God's presence replaces the temple, and the glory of God and the Lamb supplant sun and moon. **The Gospel Lesson:** Jesus performs a healing miracle on the Sabbath. In doing so he both reveals divine creative power and teaches a richer, deeper meaning for the Sabbath as a healing and creative time.







FIRST LESSON.....Acts 16:9-15 (pew Bible p. 900)

⁹During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, “Come over to Macedonia and help us.” ¹⁰When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them.

¹¹We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, ¹²and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. ¹³On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. ¹⁴A certain woman named Lydia, a worshiper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. 

¹⁰And in the spirit [one of the angels] carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God.

²²I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. ²³And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. ²⁴The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. ²⁵Its gates will never be shut by day—and there will be no night there. ²⁶People will bring into it the glory and the honor of the nations. ²⁷But nothing unclean will enter it, nor anyone who practices abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life.





RADIO SPONSORSHIP WILL INCREASE SEPT. 1 TO COVER COSTS... Radio broadcasts of worship at Grace on WRSC 1390 AM provides a live connection to Grace for homebound members, those unable to come to worship, and the community. Some members who moved away or spend winters elsewhere tune in via WRSC's streaming service. The broadcast cost is \$192 per service; we pay regardless of whether there is a sponsor. We previously asked for \$165, which does not cover the cost. Starting September 1, we will raise the sponsorship request to cover WRSC's actual \$192 charge. If you signed up before April 1, we will honor the previously suggested \$165 donation, but please consider whether you can pay the full cost. Thank you for helping us spread Christ's love.

WOMEN OF GRACE BABY SHOWER... May 2019. The Pregnancy Resource Clinic in State College will be the recipient of our shower donations. The clinic offers a range of free services: medical (e.g. ultrasound), counseling (e.g. parenting for mothers and fathers), and material assistance. Clients are served without regard to age, race, income, nationality, religious affiliation, disability or other arbitrary circumstances. The clinic is especially in need of baby shoes, size 12, 18, 24 months, both boy's and girl's. Other items needed include crib sheets; diapers for older babies (sizes 4, 5, and 6), diaper rash cream; cups, spoons, and forks; teething rings; bibs and burp clothes; and bottles. As always the clinic is grateful for \$25.00 Gift Cards to Target, Giant, Weis, Kohl's and Sheetz as well as coffee shops, restaurants, or Bath & Body Works. There is a hand out containing the list of needs available in the bassinets. We hope you will join the Women of Grace as we support this clinic.
